#### A. <u>General information concerning the district and its board of directors.</u>

The District was formed to serve the public improvement needs of the Colorado Horse Park. The District provides training and events for Douglas County and the regional equestrian community.

# B. <u>Any boundary changes for the report year and proposed changes for the coming year.</u>

There were no boundary changes in 2011, and none are expected this year.

#### C. <u>Any intergovernmental agreements, contracts for operations, debt, and other</u> <u>contractual obligations with other taxing districts.</u>

The Board approved an IGA with multiple Colorado districts through the Special District Association Property and Liability Pool through which the District obtains its insurance. There are no other IGAs or contracts with other taxing districts.

#### D. <u>Reimbursement agreements and administrative/operational and maintenance costs</u> of the District.

In 2011, the Board approved a reimbursement agreement in the form of a promissory note between the District and Helen Krieble; this agreement has subsequently been determined to be null and void, *see* Paragraph J, below. A reimbursement agreement between the District and Helen Krieble has been approved by the Board, which acknowledges the advancement of monies toward the operation in the amount of \$500,000, and provides for additional advances and reimbursement obligations as appropriate.

A reimbursement agreement between the District and Westward has since been approved by the Board, which acknowledges the advancement of monies in payment for the Colorado Horse Park facilities, in the amount of \$9,985,000.

For administrative/operational and maintenance costs, please see the 2011 and 2012 District budget attached as **Exhibit A**.

#### E. Information concerning the District's service plan, progress of the development.

Westward Enterprises, LLC, conveyed to the District the property which makes up the Colorado Horse Park facilities by quit claim deed recorded January 11, 2011. The District is currently working on plans for an indoor arena, improvements to the RV Park and additional barns.

#### F. <u>Financial plan activities.</u>

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#### G. <u>Contractual obligations.</u>

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The District has a contract with Westward Enterprises, LLC for management, operations, and maintenance of the Colorado Horse Park.

In 2011, the Board approved a promissory note and deed of trust between the District and Westward Enterprises, LLC, for the funding of the Colorado Horse Park facilities. The promissory note and deed of trust were subsequently found to have been entered into without authorization of law and therefore deemed null and void *ab initio*.

In 2011, the Board approved a promissory note between the District and Helen Krieble for general operating expenditures. The promissory note was subsequently found to have been entered into without authorization of law and therefore deemed null and void *ab initio*.

There were no other debt transactions during year 2011.

The attached 2012 Budget for Colorado Horse Park Metropolitan District includes these *important features*:

The Colorado Horse Park Metropolitan District was formed for the primary purpose of perpetually serving as the world premier amateur sports equestrian center and to promote equestrian amateur athletics in Colorado and the Rocky Mountain Region and secondarily for the purpose of providing improvements to the park such as indoor arenas.

The Park is operating successfully as planned, but the CHPMD Board of Directors is waiting for economic conditions to improve and new and current events to show solid financial improvement before issuing debt and commencing a public improvement campaign.
