NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE COUNTY OF DOUGLAS, STATE OF COLORADO, hereby proclaim that May 2014 shall be commemorated as Archaeology and Historic Preservation Month and dedicated to the memory of Penny Burdick for her tireless dedication to historic preservation.
