A RESOLUTION PROCLAIMING SEPTEMBER 2017 AS NATIONAL
PREPAREDNESS MONTH

WHEREAS, “National Preparedness Month” creates an opportunity for the residents and businesses of Douglas County to prepare their homes, businesses, and communities for any type of emergency including natural disasters and potential terror attacks; and

WHEREAS, investing in the preparedness of ourselves, our families, businesses, and communities can reduce fatalities and economic devastation in our communities and in our nation; and

WHEREAS, emergency preparedness is the responsibility of every citizen of Douglas County and all citizens are encouraged to make preparedness a priority and work together, as a team, to ensure that individuals, families, and communities are prepared for disasters and emergencies of any type; and

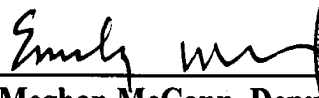
