WHEREAS, Barb served the public for over 30 years in roles at Denver's Metro Water Recovery, Roxborough Water and Sanitation District, and serving communities through private sector work; and

WHEREAS, Barb was a leader through her service on a number of boards, commissions, and councils dedicated to providing clean and abundant water to Colorado communities, including the Colorado Water Conservation Board (CWCB), Colorado Water Quality Control Commission (WQCC), Colorado Water & Wastewater Facility Operator Certification Board, CWCB Metro Roundtable, Chatfield Watershed Authority, Colorado Water Trust Board of Directors and Advisory Council member for the One World One Water Center for Metropolitan State University; and

WHEREAS, Barb also demonstrated leadership at the national level where she served and chaired various committees for the National Association of Clean Water Agencies; and

WHEREAS, as a result of her leadership and contributions at the national level, Barb was a 2015 inductee to the National Association of Clean Water Agencies' Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, Barb's sense of humor, kindness, energy, and graciousness enriched those fortunate enough to know and work with her; and

WHEREAS, Barb enjoyed sharing stories of her love for her family, friends, colleagues, and travels in the US and abroad; and


WHEREAS, Barb's true legacy lies in the profound effect she had on the countless people she served, worked alongside, and mentored throughout her career;


