**A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING VETERANS DAY AND OPERATION GREEN LIGHT**

***WHEREAS***, the residents of Douglas County have great respect, admiration, and the utmost gratitude for all the men and women who have selflessly served our country and this community in the Armed Forces; and

***WHEREAS***, the contributions and sacrifices of those who served in the Armed Forces have been vital in maintaining the freedoms and way of life enjoyed by all citizens; and

***WHEREAS***, Douglas County seeks to honor individuals who have made countless sacrifices for freedom by placing themselves in harm's way for the good of all; and

***WHEREAS***, Douglas County is home to more than 27,000 veterans; and

***WHEREAS***, veterans continue to serve our community in the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, religious groups, civil service, and by functioning as County Veterans Service Officers in 29 states to help fellow former service members access more than \$50 billion in federal health, disability and compensation benefits each year; and

***WHEREAS***, Approximately 200,000 service members transition to civilian communities annually; and

***WHEREAS***, an estimated 20 percent increase of service members will transition to civilian life in the near future; and

***WHEREAS***, studies indicate that between 44 and 72 percent of service members experience high levels of stress during transition from military to civilian life; and

***WHEREAS***, active military service members transitioning from military service are at a high risk for suicide during their first year after military service;

***WHEREAS***, Douglas County has invested in suicide prevention by offering treatment, Mental Health First Aid Training for Veterans Service Officers, creating a mental health liaison for veterans within the Veterans Service Office and providing information on the crisis line 988 to veterans; and

***WHEREAS***, Douglas County joins the National Association of Counties and encourages all counties, parishes and boroughs across the United States, to recognize Operation Green Light for Veterans; and

***WHEREAS***, Douglas County appreciates the sacrifices of our United States military personnel and believes specific recognition should be granted; and


***WHEREAS***, at its Veterans Day Event on November 11, 2024, Douglas County will place special emphasis on Purple Heart veterans that have served our country along with all their veteran counterparts; therefore;

**BE IT RESOLVED**, with designation as a Green Light for Veterans County, Douglas County hereby declares November 4<sup>th</sup> through November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024, a time to salute and honor the service and sacrifices of our men and women in uniform transitioning from active service; therefore,
